**Seven UU Principles**

**Sunday Services are held year-round**  
**10:00 to 11:00am**

MVUUF is a "lay-led" fellowship. We rely on the talents of our congregation to lead most Sunday services. A Mentoring Ministry Agreement provides the Fellowship clergy-led worship services during the year, workshops, and spiritual guidance. On occasion community leaders, visiting Unitarian Universalist clergy and local professionals may be invited to present a worship service.

Year-round, at least once a month, less formal interactive or discussion - based services are held.

All Sunday services are centered with a chalice lighting, greetings, and a sharing of personal Joys & of Concerns.

**Youth Religious Exploration** will be offered during adult services and will vary in format and content, depending on the age & number of children present. Starting this fall, a Youth Religious Exploration Stewardship Group is being formed, initially made up of parents and relatives committed to providing our children a quality Fellowship Program, through a safe, loving environment that offers each precious child the opportunity to explore 'religion' and that opens avenues for our liberal religious heritage to be passed on to their generation.

**Adult Religious Exploration** is offered from 9:00-9:45AM from September through May. Topics planned for fall & spring 2009/2010 are Judaism and Christianity. Other courses may include "Articulating Your Faith", "Spirit of Life", "Building Your Own Theology", "Our UU Story".

#### **Coffee & Lunch**

Coffee Social Follows every worship service. Enjoy casual conversation, and on occasion a sweet treat. **The last Sunday** of the each month a pot-luck gathering is held. Other Sundays, Although never really planned, just listen for the call Who wants to go to lunch? and come along!
